3 Ways to Save on Credit Card Processing

In business, every penny counts. With plastic continually becoming more popular than cold-hard cash, declining to accept credit cards is not the best way to avoid processing fees.

Although credit card processing fees are unavoidable, here are three tips to help you save money.

1. Shop Around and Negotiate with Credit Card Processors

Just like with shopping for any other product, doing a little comparison shopping can get you the best deal. Before choosing a payment processor, you should ask what the total rate is when all fees are included, if there are any cancellation, statement, service, or application fees, and if any of these can be waived. Compare fees, talk, and negotiate with different processors and choose the one that is the right fit for your business. You can later negotiate with your credit card processor by leveraging your transaction volume and being seen as a client that adds value.

2. Reduce Risk of Credit Card Fraud

If your processor is offering a tiered pricing system, it will charge more when there's a larger margin for error and risk for fraud. By having your customers insert their card into your terminal and avoiding keying in their card manually, you decrease the margin of error and reduce the risk of fraud. You can also further decrease the risk of fraud by staying EMV compliant and using a chip reader. Although the chip reader may not save you money on processing fees, it can save you money should a customer dispute your payment.

3. Impose Minimum Credit Card Sales

If you are paying at least \$0.30 per transaction, letting your customers charge \$2.00 on their credit cards is not profitable for your business. Put up a note that explains you only accept credit cards with a minimum sale amount that makes sense for your business and processing fees.




